

# COVID-19 Top-Up Grant

## Aim

The COVID-19 Top-Up Grant aims to provide Expenditure on Manpower (EOM) and Other Operating Expenses (OOE) funding for ongoing NMRC-funded projects that are impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

## Application Eligibility

- The applicant must be the Lead Principal Investigator (PI)/Corresponding PI of an ongoing NMRC project with start date before 1 Jan 2021 (i.e. not applicable to recently awarded projects) and end date after 31 Dec 2021.
- The ongoing NMRC project must be awarded under NMRC competitive research project grants based on the programme list on next slide.

## Award Details

- The requested top-up amount should not exceed \$300K per application, and to support only EOM and OOE vote. No indirect cost will be provided.
- Existing project details including project objectives, methodologies, deliverables and grant T&Cs should remain unchanged.

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## Additional Criteria/Points to Note

- Top-up funding must be utilised within 2 years or before the project end date, whichever is earlier. No extension request for the top-up funding will be allowed.
- Applicants and institutions should take into consideration other similar supplementary or top-up schemes such as the Job Support Scheme (JSS) to ensure that there is no overlap/double-dipping of funds.
- Applicants should provide strong justifications on how their projects were affected by the pandemic and the top-up amount requested.
- The top-up funding is not meant for PI to pursue additional work that is not approved in the original project proposal.
- Reporting for the top-up component will be done as part of the reporting mechanism of the existing project which the top-up is tied to.

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## Review Process

- The review process will take about 2-3 months after application closes

## Assessment Criteria

- Compelling Justifications provided to demonstrate how the project was affected by COVID-19
- Reasonableness of the requested budget, taking into consideration the
  - Awarded project budget
  - Budget balance
  - Remaining project duration
